Sunday. A request for bottled water and/or funds to buy the water will occur in late June. Prayerfully consider joining with this outreach to our community. More information will follow on how to participate.




Open Arms


The *Missions Committee* is going to start collecting personal adult items to be donated to *Open Arms Food Pantry*. The

Please consider donating blood on June 10th in Wesley Hall from 9:30 am to 1:30 pm. *Versiti* is the agency that will be the collecting blood. The UMCA goal is 15 blood products! Versiti Illinois has been working to save lives since 1943; they provide blood products for 63 hos-



pitals and blood banks in Illinois. Blood is in very low supply following the pandemic. Normally, blood banks have five days supply on hand, but these days they are likely to only have enough for

one day! Who needs blood? People who have cancer, major surgery, hemophilia, sickle cell disease, crushing injuries, cesarean sections, etc., may all need blood. You can sign up on line or on the list in Wesley Hall. See the fliers throughout our church and on the UMCA web page and *Facebook*. Donors must be at least 18 years of age. 
