BEYOND THE CURRICULUM

There was an article in the Chicago Tribune dated Sunday, April 18, 2021 by Heidi Stevens. It was entitled Symbol of Inclusion. The story is about Pride and Black Lives Matter flags that three teach-



ers hung in their classrooms. The school removed them. Students and parents met with the school board to express their desire for the board to look beyond the flags and see what their displaying represents, i.e., love, allies, safety, inclusion,

and equal treatment under the laws that are supposed to protect. Kelly Hennings, a lifelong resident of Chesterton, Indiana, commented to the article's author. "Ask anyone from the USA about their favorite teacher," Hennings wrote. "Not one person will mention a teacher who stayed strictly within the curriculum." "Exactly," wrote Miss Stevens. "Teachers can show kids so much more than facts, equations, and dates. They show kids what to value, where they fit in, how to find their voice, how to use their power, who they can be and how to shape the world." Teachers have been a major influence in my formative years, and I know we have many educators in Antioch UMC. RETURN TO WORSHIP

The **Return to Worship Team** would like to

share the following updates to operations at the church during the week and during Sunday worship services. These updates are based on current stable COVID results in Region 9, and the rapidly expanding rollout of the vaccines.



Basic safety guidelines such as wearing your mask indoors, and social distancing remain in place.

1) Committees or church groups may meet at the church up to two times per day. Previously, this was limited to one meeting per day. Please continue to schedule meetings with the church secretary and use the space in Wesley Hall to meet.

2) We will record the entire Sunday services



via Facebook Live for those members who wish to worship at home. We will then copy the Facebook Live video to YouTube for those who may not use Facebook. This will allow us to phase out the

current **Zoom** video service over the next 30 days. Many thanks to Debbie and the Zoom worship team for all their efforts to provide this virtual worship option for the past year!

3) We are going to restart the *yellow prayer* cards for Joys and Concerns during Sunday worship. Since we are recording the service via Facebook Live, you will have the option of checking a box on the yellow card if you do not want your prayer request recorded on the video.

Note: The online reservation process will

continue for now with one service at 9:00 am. We will continue to monitor attendance and expand to two services as needed.

The Early Adopters Program is in full swing. We have completed the first leg of the program which is a ten-year collection of data on attendance, giving, mission outreach, and other important information with regard to our church. This



document couldn't have been completed without a lot of folks helping to gather the information. The second data piece is the online survey our con-

gregation was invited to complete a few weeks ago. The EA team is still meeting about this tool and will share the results with the congregation soon. The last data piece is Mission Insite where they go out in a three-mile radius of Antioch to look at potential

areas that could help us know more about how we could better connect with our neighbors. We haven't had a community chance to look at this data much as a team, but will alert you when we have. The team has met several times



with one of the authors, Paul Nixon, of the Early Adopters program via **Zoom.** We also are meeting to direct our research toward ways to help bring new disciples to Christ and strengthen our church family in outreach and possible new programs.

COVID 19 Vaccine Update

Just this week, LCHD received 47,000 doses

of the *Pfizer* and *Moderna* vaccines which means they can give between 2500 to 3000 doses per day! Due to the pause, the J&J vaccine is in short supply, though this will improve.



All residents 16 years of age and older may now make their own appointments in AllVax! Go into your allvax account; the gray button will now be blue for you to make your appointment at the fairgrounds or the Waukegan Water Street sites. There will be a separate button for 16 and 17 year olds as they may only register for the Pfizer vaccine. Emails will be going out to all Lake County residents to inform them of this change. The LCHD sites are now also accepting appointments for those who received their first dose elsewhere and need the second dose. Also, the fairgrounds will be open from 1:00 pm to 7:00 pm Wednesdays beginning May 5th.
