Flu and Covid Vaccine Clinic

This event will be held on Saturday, October 7th from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon in Wesley Hall. Registration will begin September 10th. Look for a sign up sheet as well as a link to *Sign Up Genius*. We need a minimum of 20 to be able to hold the clinic.

RSV Vaccine

You may remember that last fall/winter, we were exposed to the triple threat of flu, Covid and

RSV. RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus) can be quite serious in vulnerable people (infants and older adults) causing inflammation of the small airways in the lungs and pneumonia. Please check with



your physician to see if they recommend one of the new RSV vaccines for you.

Some have asked if it would be possible to get all three of these vaccines at the clinic on October 7th. The pharmacist at *Walgreens* suggests getting the RSV vaccine in September at least two weeks before the flu and Covid vaccines, The RSV vaccine takes extra time to prepare which she feels would make it difficult to administer given the time constraints of the clinic. Both the flu and Covid



vaccines have been updated to give

protection against the most recent strains of these two viruses.
